Home for Easter Week: great effort with good learning

The *Home for Easter Week'* initiative took place from Wednesday 5th April to Tuesday 11th April.

The week allowed us to trial new ideas and analyse further the patient flow blockages through our hospital. It involved 49 clinical areas and 131 volunteer ward liaison officers (internal and external).

We achieved 84.5% for four hour emergency dept wait target over the seven days (it was 79% the previous week). For the first time in a long while, we discharged more people (1626) than we admitted (1564).

The week highlighted the three key areas affecting performance:

- Emergency department medical staffing (waiting time to see a doctor, especially at night)
- 7/7 services (over the weekends)
- Out of hospital services (delayed transfers of care and delayed discharges)

We are going to bring in a new model of 24/7 site management, to give our organisation the same senior support that we had over Home For Easter Week.

Adrian Belton appointed as new Chair: officially starts on 1st June 2017

Adrian Belton has been appointed as the new Chair of Stockport NHS Foundation Trust. He will formally start his new role on 1st June 2017.

Adrian brings a wealth of public and private sector experience, at both national and regional level, to the organisation. He has held chief executive roles at the Construction Industry Training Board (CITB) and FERA, formerly the national Food and Environment Research Agency. He led the merger of four organisations to create FERA and he also brings integration experience from his times as an executive director of Nottingham City Council and subsequently in the creation of Natural England as a new non-departmental public body.

Adrian previously worked at board level within banking and financial services, with risk director roles at Barclays and the Bradford and Bingley Group. In addition, he has held non-executive roles over the last 10 years. These include chairman of the Institute of Environmental Management and Assessment and a member on the Council of Sheffield University, where he sits on the audit committee.

Adrian is a successor to Gillian Easson who announced her retirement last October, after 10 years with the Trust.


Financial update: £9.9m loss at end of financial year

Our annual budget is £270 million and, at the end of our 2016/17 financial year (31st March 2017), we have made a £9.9 million loss.

This loss/deficit is still draft and may be reduced with some extra sustainability & transformation fund money from NHS Improvement (around £1.8 million).

We needed to save £25.7 million for 2016/17. We have saved £14.6 million. £8 million of this saving is recurrent (ie: a saving year on year). This is better than previous years, but £11.1 million short of what it needed to be. Achieving savings remains a huge challenge.


Quality for March: update on key areas where we failed to hit the target



PATIENT EXPERIENCE (Friends & Family test, 40% target response rate for inpatient & day cases): 93% of our patients were 'extremely likely' or 'likely' to recommend us - but our response rate was 34% which is below the target

DISCHARGE SUMMARY (95% published within 48 hrs) & **CLINIC LETTERS** (95% within 14 days): Discharge summary was 88%. Clinic (outpatient) letters was 69%.

Performance for March: update on key areas where we failed to hit the target



A&E FOUR HOUR WAIT (four hours until admission/referral/discharge, 95% target): We achieved 79.8% for March.

There is a proposal to create an urgent and emergency care board for Greater Manchester. On a Greater Manchester level a lot of work is planned around informatics and workforce, including recruitment and retention of middle grade doctors.
